Dr. Michael Satlin an infectious diseases physician and Associate Professor of Medicine and of Pathology and Laboratory Medicine at Weill Cornell Medicine. He is the Clinical Director of the Transplantation-Oncology Infectious Diseases Program at Weill Cornell. He completed medical school at the University of Virginia School of Medicine and internal medicine residency and infectious diseases fellowship training at NewYork-Presbyterian Hospital/Weill Cornell. He also has a Master's Degree in Clinical and Translational Investigation at Weill Cornell. His research focuses on the epidemiology, prevention, and treatment of multidrug-resistant Gram-negative infections, with a focus on immunocompromised hosts, and he has multiple NIHfunded grants to support this work. He is Associate Editor of Journal of Antimicrobial Chemotherapy-Antimicrobial Resistance, serves on the Editorial Board of Journal of Clinical Microbiology, and on the Editorial Advisory Board of Clinical Infectious Diseases. He has authored or co-authored over 85 peer-reviewed manuscripts. He is a Member of the Clinical and Laboratory Standards Institute's (CLSI) Subcommittee on Antimicrobial Susceptibility Testing and Co-Chair of its Breakpoint Working Group. He also serves on the ASM Microbe Program Committee and is a member of multiple committees for the NIAID's Antibacterial Resistance Leadership Group.
